## A Thought for Lent

Have you ever thought of Lent as a yearly second chance? Each year we have six weeks to take a long, loving look at our lives to see if our values and priorities are in line with God's desires for us. We may find that we've wandered from God's path, Lent becomes that second chance to "return to God with our whole heart." During this Lent, did we decide to support one another in whatever we chose to do? As we journey through Lent, remember that each step brings us closer to the welcoming arms of our loving God. Make the season of Lent a meaningful time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving for yourself, your loved ones, and your community. Invite family members to share their thoughts, hopes, and desires for Lent and the coming season.

## Looking at the Readings

'There is always safety and security in the mob mentality. Jesus models for us a different approach; one which embraces the risk of being different.' Ian Elmer -A Reflection on the Adulterous Woman.

Safe and secure Jesus was not when surrounded by malicious men with stones in hand a terrified woman trembling before him he takes control of an extremely fraught situation. As master of the moment he uses silence to create some space then bends down perhaps to be closer to the cowering woman as a comforting presence and writes in the dust. Imagine the tension as with all eyes focussed on Jesus and all ears listening for his response they wait. Imagine the change in atmosphere as he pronounces his verdict 'Let him who is without sin...' and as he again bends and continues to write in the dust the accusers melt away one by one. It's impossible for most of us to imagine the relief and gratitude of the accused woman as left alone with Jesus she hears the words 'Neither do I condemn you'. In the Creation Story God formed humankind from the dust of the earth. Now Jesus saves this woman from certain death giving her life once again. Perhaps in the dust he had with his finger been describing her as the way she must have felt - a new creation.

Are the words Pope Francis spoken to journalists at an unscheduled press conference on a flight home 'Who am I to judge?' reminiscent of the words of Jesus in today's story 'Neither do I condemn you.' During this Jubilee Year of Mercy, a year in which we grow ever more convinced of God's loving forgiveness, are we listening more intently to the words of Pope Francis? Are we asking ourselves how can we show others the Mercy of God? We say that God loves us and has mercy on us; our actions need to genuinely reflect God's forgiveness. As disciples of Jesus we have to put mercy before judgment remembering that in any event God's judgement will always be in the light of mercy.

During this Year of Mercy let us grow accustomed in experiencing the joy of encountering that Grace which transforms all things, the sweet and gentle touch of God's forgiveness especially in moments of greatest need.

**Jesus is the Compassionate Merciful Healer**

**What is 'Sin'?**

When we make sinful choices, we are not living not 'living true' to our identity as people created in God's image, baptised into the new life of Christ. 'Sin' is freely chosen action, or failure to act, that contradicts Jesus' 'law of love' (John 15:12-14). Sinful actions are neither life giving nor loving: they harm relationships with others, with God, self, creation. We become *less free* to choose what is good, true and loving in the future.

Jesus Christ showed the way to *freedom from* all that holds us back from being as God created us to be: *freedom for* genuinely loving relationships and life in all its fullness (John 10:10; John 15:12-14). We are always being called to a 'change of heart', a radical turning away from sin, to really turn towards God who loves us first, and wants to help us every step of the way. Following Jesus, we can make a difference in our world; "in fact the kingdom of God is among you." (Luke 17:21)

**Becoming Forgiving People**

At first, Peter tried to put limits on forgiveness; 'Lord...how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times'(Mt 18:21-22). In the 'Our Father', Jesus taught us that God's forgiveness for us is closely tied to our willingness to forgive others: 'Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us...' (Luke 11:4, Matthew 6:12).

**The Sacrament of Reconciliation**

The Sacrament of God's forgiveness is called Reconciliation, because it is about reconciling relationships, with God, ourselves and others. It is also called the Sacrament of 'penance', 'confession', 'forgiveness'. It is a Sacrament of 'healing': Jesus does not simply forgive our harmful and life drying actions. He desires to heal the source from which these actions come. Therefore, when preparing for this sacrament, we need to go beyond recalling our actions and ask God's help to identify the deeper areas of our life in need of healing.
