Looking at the Readings

The new city of God is built on the foundation of the apostles, but on its gates are inscribed the names of the tribes of Israel. These names represent the openness to all nations, races, peoples and tongues. The resurrection of Jesus has radically transformed the way we live together and the way we live with God.

What must we do to be saved? The question put to Jesus centuries ago is still asked today, and the answer is still the same. We must believe and we must love God and love one another. We will be recognised as resurrection people by our active faith and by our unselfish love, not by an exterior mark, regardless of how sacred. This change in requirements for membership does not diminish the rigour of our religious obligations. Rather, it suggests that we may always have to reinterpret the law, for what is appropriate at one time and in one place may be inappropriate in another. With the early Christians, we will need the guidance of the Holy Spirit in this very delicate process. This is why the departing Jesus assures us that the Spirit will come to us to teach us all things.

The final gift that Jesus promises to give is his own peace, a peace that he has won by overcoming sin and death. This peace issues from the union that Jesus enjoys with God, a union which we are now invited to share. © Dianne Bergant CSS

Saints Philip and James, Apostles (Tuesday 3 May)

Philip was born at Bethsaida and started as a disciple of John the Baptist. After the Baptist's death he followed Christ. James, a cousin of the Lord, was the son of Alphaeus. He ruled the Church at Jerusalem; wrote an epistle; led an austere life; and converted many Jews to the Faith. He was martyred in the year 62.

Geoff provides Dental care at Projeto Montanha, whilst Vicki assists in the training of local women with sewing and cooking education.....all worthwhile life skills. Projeto Montanha is a small Non Government Organisation run by Gi and Eduardo Trucco a Christian couple from Brazil, who are committed to providing educational programs to young people and their families. These beautiful people have been following God's direction in Aileu for almost ten years with the firm belief that God can change lives through nurture and care. \$5 is all that is needed to enable a Mother to attend a cooking course at Projeto Montanha for 1month.

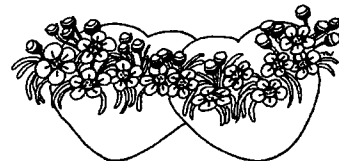

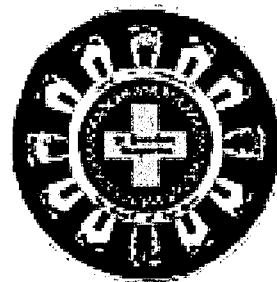

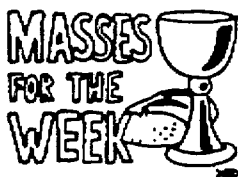
