Liturgical Jottings

Imagination part 1

Imagination is a practical tool that serves both in planning and in bringing to life the liturgical actions of the church at prayer. Ritual is presented to the church in the most meagre form of written text with even more meagre rubrics or directives for its enactment. It falls to imagination to help transform those written texts into living actions by which people may "express in their lives and manifest to others the mystery of Christ and the nature of the true church" (SC, 2). Looking at the Readings

Today's gospel continues to confront us with the radical challenge of following Jesus. All measures of what makes life good and engaging – family, possessions, wellbeing – are to be rejected as distractions from the call to follow Jesus as true disciples. And Jesus makes it clear that we need to consider seriously whether we can take up this call, whether we have what it takes.

So what is it to follow Jesus? It is to carry our cross and come after him. Note that Jesus says we are to carry OUR cross, not his cross. Following Jesus is to join him in his mission to embody the compassionate, merciful, inclusive love of God for all people, in our own place and time, and to be prepared for what that will unavoidably cost us, whether that cost may be close family relationships if family members are on about very different values, or personal wealth and possessions or social standing. What is the cross that I am called to carry, and what is it costing me?

Feast of the Week: Birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Thursday 8 September. The feast arose in the East in the 6th century and in the West under Pope Sergius I (a Syrian) in the 8th century, honouring her conception (8 December) and her birth.

Dr Susan Timoney, comes to us after delivering one of the keynote addresses and workshops at **PROCLAIM 2016** in Sydney and an evening in Melbourne focused on **'The Parish as a Centre of Mercy...Where to Now?'**

As the Secretary for Pastoral Ministry and Social Concerns at the Archdiocese of Washington, Dr. Timoney coordinates evangelization initiatives and pastoral planning for archdiocesan parishes. She oversees the work of the Office of Family Life, the Office of Young Adult Ministry and the Office of Hispanic Catholics. Dr. Timoney earned her STD at the University of Saint Thomas Aquinas (Angelicum) in Rome where she focused on theology and Christian Spirituality. Susan lived and worked at the Lay Center at Foyer Unitas, a community of lay women and men studying at the Pontifical Universities in Rome. Today, Susan serves as a board member for the Lay Centre.

Susan is an Assistant Adjunct faculty member in the School of Theology and Religious Studies at The Catholic University of America, where she has taught in the undergraduate and graduate programs. Currently she teaches a course on pastoral leadership in the doctorate in ministry program. Susan teaches a course on the ministry of spiritual direction in the online theology program at St. Joseph's College, Maine. In addition to teaching, Dr. Timoney lectures nationally and internationally on themes related to evangelization and the lay vocation and ministry. She is a contributor to the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) video reflections on the



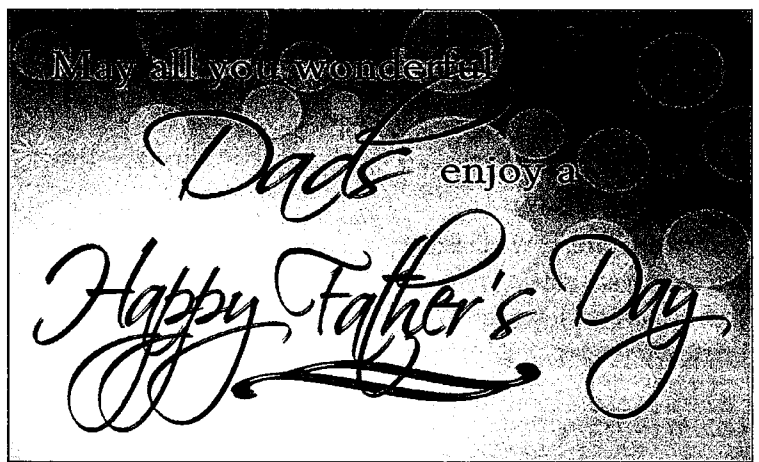

Did He Say Hate?

I had an interesting meeting with a mum when I was a parish youth minister a few years ago. The woman's daughter had spent a lot of time with us at youth-group activities. So mum wanted to make sure we were all okay.

I tell that story because this Gospel highlights this fact for many young people: active discipleship can raise questions at home. Some parents get concerned when their teenagers start making friends their parents don't know. Bad church experiences can make it hard for some parents to accept a child's good experiences. Parents who want more family time can get frustrated when a child wants to spend more time at church activities.

So your commitment to Jesus might cause friction at home, but don't misunderstand the Gospel, Jesus says to "hate" people, but according to Scripture scholars, he doesn't mean we should feel hatred. He means we should choose God's will over all people and things. And that should make us treat family and friends with more love.

If your faith choices do cause friction at home, here are some tips for responding with love:

Talk and listen

Many parents just want to know what you're up to. Make time to discuss your faith choices with them.

Be patient

Many parents struggle with faith. That can make it hard for them to understand yours

Value family time

Don't forget that discipleship calls us to serve our families, not just our parishes, youth groups, and the poor.

Seek help

If tension is high at home, find someone to dialogue with who can help you choose a Christian response.

Give them a break

It's tough raising young people – even a Christian one.

When has a faith choice caused friction between you and your parents or friends?

The Action

Choosing to put Christ first and being a disciple is quite radical and countercultural. Fortunately, we have many great examples of what it means to be a true disciple and the goodness that comes out of that choice in the lives of saints. Take some time this week to research a saint who turned away from familial expectations to follow Christ. Saint Teresa of Calcutta might be a good place to start. Mother Teresa will be canonised by Pope Francis this Sunday in Rome.
