Looking at the Readings

Over the last few weeks, our gospel readings have made it clear that following Jesus is a radical, challenging and costly option. As this is not an easy choice, those who do try to take it up in their own lives will find it very difficult at times to stay with it, and may find themselves falling away.

Today's gospel focuses on what attitude the community of disciples needs to have toward those who try but fail, and then seek to return and be reconciled with the community — an attitude contrasted with the Pharisees and scribes at the beginning of today's reading, and the elder brother towards its end. The parables of the lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost son all clearly call for the community of disciples to be known for "rejoicing that those who were lost are now found. This attitude embodies God's compassionate, merciful and inclusive love. In the Lord's Prayer, we ask God to forgive us as we forgive others. How good am I at forgiving with joy?.

To re-affirm:

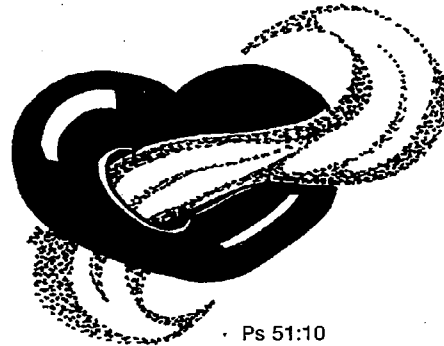
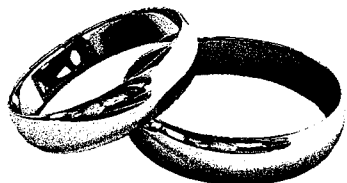
- The value of marriage, which as a binding public commitment becomes the foundation of healthy families, healthy children, and a healthy community.
