Liturgical Jottings

The Rosary – Part 1.

October is a month set aside to Mary and the Rosary. If you are not used to the Rosary it may seem very repetitious. Look at the ten Hail Mary's as a mantra to help you meditate on the Mystery or the prayer itself. Let us look at the prayer:

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

Make this personal as you say it, put your name in instead of Mary. In my case, "Hail John, full of grace". What does it feel like to be addressed by an angel, a messenger from God? Are you 'full of grace'? What does it feel like to be full of grace?

Looking at the Readings

This passage is taken from Luke, Chapter 17 where Jesus is addressing his disciples. The Apostles ask for the Lord to increase their faith. The Gospel quotes some sayings from Jesus. Jesus admonishes his disciples not to be like the Pharisees who pay lip service to what they should do. Here faith is linked not with having something but something you do! Faith is not a noun but a verb. Doing faith means serving others.

The mustard seed is one of the smallest seeds yet it grows into one of the largest trees. The mulberry tree has a complicated root system that makes it very difficult to move.

Obedience to God is not a means to some reward. It is simply what being an apostle and a disciple is about. We are not called to serve to get something in return but to serve because we have received such a great gift.

This week live out your faith. Do some acts of service for others, not because you have to, but because you want to. See your service of others as serving.

Feast of the Week: Tuesday 4 October.

St Francis of Assisi (1181-1226) patron saint of animals and ecology, a poet, reformer, promoter of peace and joy and devoted to the poor and the cross of Christ, founder of the Franciscan Orders and started the practice of the Christmas crib in churches.

Parish Finance Update

We have a significant amount of capital works being undertaken around the Parish at the moment which is great in that it continues to enhance the safety, appearances and ensure the longevity of all of our facilities, but as with all things this comes with a financial cost to the Parish so we want to share with everyone an update on the various projects we have on the go, and the financial cost that goes with them:

Parish Office

You may have noticed that since some early weather delays the progress of the Parish Office integration into the Parish Centre building is really taking shape! Painting and internal fitout is well underway and we hope to have the project completed and the team moved into their new facility before the end of October. (approx. cost \$270K)

Church Rising Damp

Following the installation of the under floor ventilation system about 6 weeks ago, we are now waiting on the contractors to complete the 2nd part of stage 1 being the installation of the Lectros electro osmotic dampcourse system which will assist in drying out the building. Once this has been in place for around 6 months we will have the salt levels assessed and establish any further rectification work required. (approx. cost stage 1 only \$47K)

Driveway Pavement

Contractors are in the process of submitting final quotes to replace the uneven and damaged asphalt pavement that runs from the carpark to the church and from the presbytery western carport to the road. Once we have awarded the job and the weather fines up a bit we will be straight into making these improvements (est. cost \$25K)

Church & Presbytery Roof

Both of these roofs are showing signs of their age and beginning to leak. It is imperative for the overall maintenance of the structures that we invest in ensuring they are water tight. Over the coming months we will be investigating this further and putting plans in place to attend to their needs. (est. cost combined \$60K)

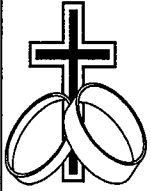
Church Carpet replacement

We have continued to nurse through the tiring carpet for some time now and very soon this will need to be replaced in the interest of ongoing safety and overall appearance of the church. Soon we'll obtain firm quotes for this replacement and make a decision on the road forward. (est. cost \$50K)

Another way of looking at coffee and chocolate ...



It is just over 150 years since the anti-slavery laws were passed in America. Yet in the world today there are nearly 27-30 million people trapped in various forms of slavery. Here in the 'lucky country' we too are exposed to forms of slavery: Recently three Parishioners attended an information day in Shepparton run by ACRATH (Australian Catholic Religious against Trafficking of Humans). The primary discussions on this day were based around human trafficking within Australia.

This was a very sobering day; however there are things that we as committed Christians can do! ACRATH is behind a drive to try and eradicate child slavery and trafficking on chocolate plantations. A large amount of chocolates available for purchase comes from cocoa harvested in West Africa.

'Presently children as young as 12 years old are picking cocoa in West Africa to make the chocolate we eat. Some of these children are trafficked. Most are forced to pick cocoa from an early age for minimal or no wages, for long hours, in dangerous working conditions, without any possibility of attending school. Most of these children have never tasted chocolate.' ACRATH website.

ACRATH has a campaign to educate people on buying 'slavery free' chocolate. By 2013, this campaign had six brands of chocolate sold under the heading of 'slavery free chocolate'

Here in our town we are fortunate that our local IGA supports these brands! We, as consumers, have much power in helping to stop this practice. We encourage you to be aware of the brands that contain fair trade symbols, and support our local supermarket in supplying them.

Tea and coffee can also be bought under these labels and hopefully by the end of the year there will be an app we can use to discern which products we can buy here in Australia to support 'slavery free' products.

Pope Francis says: "The human person ought never to be sold or bought as if he or she were a commodity. Whoever uses human persons in this way and exploits them, even if indirectly, becomes an accomplice of injustice."

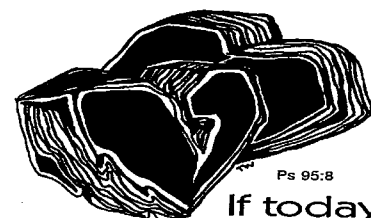
