Burglars in the night

Jesus' sayings reveal him to be a clever storyteller. His use of images captivated his audience. However, we have tended to endow his every word with awesome significance. In today's reading Jesus used a confronting image simply to gain his audience's attention. He does not intend to suggest that God sneaks up on us like a burglar to catch us out. The image conveys the need to prepare for what might happen unexpectedly.

Looking at the Readings

We may be accustomed to think of Advent as the time when we prepare for the coming of God, but the readings also train our attention on our own journey to God. We see this most clearly in this first Sunday with readings that tell us the identity of the pilgrims, the destination toward which they travel, and the way of life that is required of them on their journey. As the Vatican Council has proclaimed: We are a pilgrim people.

Both the reading from Isaiah and the psalm response speak of the pilgrimage to the mountain of the Lord, the place where God can be found. Although the psalm speaks about Jerusalem and refers to the temple there, the broader theological significance of the mountain, the city and the temple is one and the same. They represent the presence of God in our midst, and this presence is the goal of our striving. There are clear directions about how we are to live while we are on this pilgrimage to God. In Isaiah we learn that we must put away our instruments of violence and hatred, our swords and our spears. Lest we pick them up again, we are told to convert them into life-producing implements, into ploughs and pruning hooks. Paul exhorts us to put away our deeds of darkness and self-indulgence and to clothe ourselves instead in the deeds of Jesus Christ. Roll Back the Stone

Valuing life more means deciding what to do with the time that is given to each of us, no matter what age we may be. It means deciding to be ourselves, to be the person we are meant to be, which means using our God-given gifts and talents, not hiding behind a façade, conforming to what others think we should or should not be. Jesus called on Lazarus to come forth, to live again. He didn't ask for someone else, just Lazarus. Quite often, we are asked to come forth too – not to be someone else but to bring to life the person we are called to be.

Anything really worthwhile takes effort and commitment. Being sensitive to those invitations begins by having some sense of God in our everyday consciousness. That isn't easy today – we don't have the cultural software to assist us, as perhaps was the case in the past.

We don't always have the humility to admit that there is Something or Someone greater than me in all this, that there are some things that just defy explanation.

In his eulogy to his brother Robert, Ted Kennedy said: What we can do is to live out our lives as best we can with purpose, and love, and joy. We can use each day to show those who are closest to us how much we care about them, and treat others with the kindness and respect that we wish for ourselves. We can learn from our mistakes and grow from our failures. And we can strive at all costs to make a better world, so that someday, if we are blessed with the chance to look back on our time here, we can know that we spent it well; that we made a difference; that our fleeting presence had a lasting impact on the lives of other human beings.
