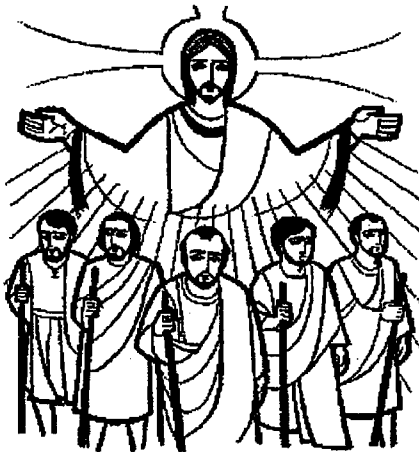

## Liturgical Jottings

### Votive Masses

Last two weeks Ritual Masses and Masses for various needs and occasions were featured. Another group of Masses, called Votive Masses, may also be celebrated on days without feasts and that celebrate the mystery of God, Christ, Mary, Angels and the Saints. They include Holy Trinity, Mercy of God, Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Eternal High Priest, Mystery of the Holy Cross, Holy Eucharist, Holy Name of Jesus, Precious Blood, Sacred Heart of Jesus and Holy Spirit. The votive Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary include a general Mass and three under the titles of Mother of the Church, Holy Name and Queen of the Apostles. Votive Masses of angels and saints include Holy Angels, St John the Baptist, St Joseph, All Apostles, Sts Peter and Paul, One Holy Apostle and one for all the Saints

## Looking at the Readings

Today, when we describe a person as being the 'salt of the earth' it's generally meant in a way that says the person is hard working, straight talking and pretty down to earth. It's usually meant as a compliment but sometimes can come across as a bit condescending when used inappropriately. When Jesus tells the disciples that they are salt of the earth and the light of the world he is really saying 'You are to be the salt of the earth; you are to be the light of the world.' It is more of a directive than an affirmation of them.

Today's first reading from Isaiah helps to shed light on Jesus' meaning in the gospel passage: 'Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn.' It sounds a lot like the message from the last judgment in Matthew 25 when the king says 'whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.' It's a message of justice and right relationship not only with God but with one another also.

To be salt of the earth and light of the world means to be the one who puts their hand up and steps forward to speak for, work for and act for those who are the least in this world. To have the potential and resources to be a force for good in the world and not act on it is to be like salt that's used for salting the streets or a lamp that's under a tub. © Greg Sunter

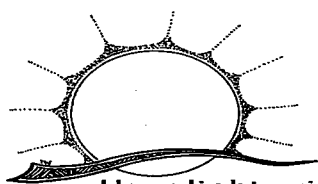
## Reflection

***Pope Francis has declared 8 February 2017 to be the world day of prayer, reflection and action against human trafficking.***

He chose this day because it is the feast day of St Josephine Bakhita, patron saint of Sudan and victim of slavery. Josephine Bakhita was kidnapped as a child from Africa and sold into slavery in the Sudan and in Italy before being freed and becoming a Canossian Sister.

The United Nations estimates that today one in every three victims of trafficking is a child.

This week join ACRATH (Australian Catholic Religious Against Trafficking in Humans) and the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference in prayer, reflection and action.

**NOTRE DAME COLLEGE  
MASTER PLAN DEVELOPMENT**

During 2014, NDC undertook a Master Plan development process to:

- produce an innovative and flexible site development plan matching the College Mission and Values Statement
- provide architectural concepts that respond creatively to site, planning and pedagogical objectives
- propose facilities which will serve as an exemplar for the school's vision for its 21st Century Teaching and Learning objectives as well as our Student Pastoral Care System with architecture serving to articulate this to the school and wider community
- document future physical building plans for Notre Dame College
- plan for future development with a high degree of certainty, commitment and confidence
- provide the College Board and the College Community the certainty as to how the site is planned to be developed and managed within the time frame of the Master Plan
- minimise impacts created by the further development of the College
- provide greater recreational space for the Knight Street South Campus
- properly manage student movement at Knight Street and Emmaus

**BUILDING PROJECTS IDENTIFIED**

The Master Plan identified 5 major capital developments over the life of the plan. Although design is only conceptual at this stage, the total cost of implementing Stages 2 to 5 of the Master Plan is estimated to be between \$27m and \$34.5m.

Whilst this plan is ambitious, we secured a grant to contribute towards Stage 1, the Trades Skills Centre which has been constructed on South Side Knight Street Campus during 2015.

During 2016/2017, Stage 2, the Science Jennings Mungovan Centre, will be completed. This is at a cost of approximately \$8m. This stage comprises 8 specialist Science rooms and 8 general purpose classrooms.

Beyond this, we have 3 major capital developments identified as follows:

<u>Stage 3</u> \$5.5-\$7.5m	Arts Centre and General Purpose Learning Areas (GPLAs) (South Side Knight St) We aim to commence the Arts Centre late 2017 and complete during 2018
<u>Stage 4</u> \$10-\$12m	Performing Arts Centre (North Side Knight St)
<u>Stage 5</u> \$5-\$6.5m	Canteen, Learning Enrichment and General Purpose Learning Areas (South Side Knight St)

In addition to these 5 stages, we have several minor and major refurbishment works to improve the environment of other areas within the College, not identified as individual stages within the Master Plan. During 2015 we landscaped the Year 9 area to provide paths between buildings and improved drainage. During 2016, we added Science and Art portables at Emmaus, we replaced the Stadium floor and completed more landscaping at Emmaus.

To complete further stages we will continue to seek grants (very difficult to secure), increase borrowings and draw on Building Fund contributions.

The timing of future stages will be dependent upon capacity to service debt responsibly.

The level of Building Fund voluntary contributions received will affect the timeline for future building projects and other refurbishments required.
